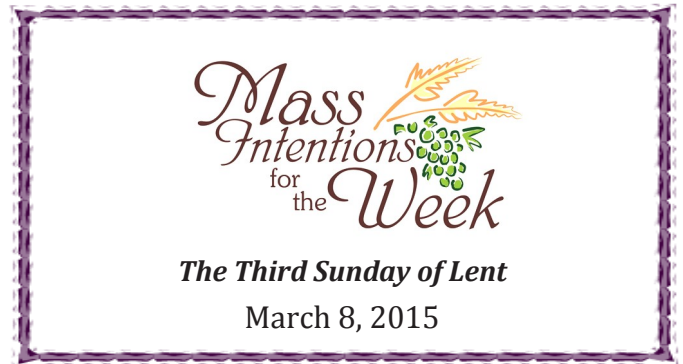

Dear Parishioners:

Yes, another Sunday and another snowstorm! It seems to be a constant refrain in this column. Yet another snowstorm arrived last weekend! Let's hope and pray that spring weather comes soon! I don't know about you but I am more than ready for warm sunny weather!

I am grateful to Kevin McDevitt for his fine job last weekend helping us with the Catholic Charity Appeal In-Pew Solicitation. This method has proven to be successful across the Diocese of Providence. There is only one parish left that still collects for the CCA by going door to door. A few others only do mailings to collect donations.

Since we have begun the in-pew solicitation our total raised for the CCA has increased by nearly \$50,000! But more importantly the number of donors has increased and includes nearly 150 new donors.

If you have made your pledge or given your donation to the CCA, I thank you for your generous support. Last weekend we were able to raise \$32,000 toward our parish goal of \$193,000. As has been said these funds are the major source of funding for the many charitable works of our Church. Everyday thousands are served and helped by our many Diocesan agencies and your donations make it possible.

We invite every parish family to consider pledging a gift of \$250 over 10 months. Your gift of \$25 per month (that's just \$5 a

week!) goes a long way in ensuring that our many brothers and sisters who are in need, who are suffering in sickness, and who live in poverty, are served.

We are blessed at Our Lady of Mercy that many of our parishioners are so generous in supporting the CCA. Some are very generous in supporting the CCA by becoming Bishop's Partners in Charity. There are about 70 parishioners who are members of the BPC and generously donate \$1,000, and many who donate much, much more. If you have been greatly blessed in life, we ask you to consider sharing your blessings by becoming a Bishop's Partner in Charity and donating \$1,000 or more.

Whatever amount you are willing to donate, please know of my gratitude for your generosity. But also know of the gratitude and thanks of the many people whose lives' you impact with your donation. The homeless, the refugees, prisoners, the dying, the sick, the addicted, and the poor are indeed grateful for your generous support of the CCA.

If you have not yet made your pledge or given your donation, please take the envelope provided, in the pews, home and return it next weekend. You can simply place it in the regular collection baskets in the coming weeks, put it in the mail or drop it off at the Parish Office. We are steadily making our way toward our parish goal but need all 2,500 families at Our Lady of Mercy to support the CCA in

order to reach it.

I thank Mrs. Grace Murphy who organized this weekend's new blanket collection for the homeless. Your generous donation of a blanket, or two, helps a homeless person stay warm during these cold and snowy days. Any blankets can be dropped off in the collection box in the vestibule. Thank you for your support.

Lent is coasting along as March has arrived and we enter our third week of this holy season. We continue to pray, fast and give alms as we attempt to deepen our conversion to Christ. This conversion to Christ can only lead to a life of more fulfillment, deeper meaning and greater happiness.

At his weekly Angelus message last Sunday, Pope Francis reminded us: *"The way of Jesus always leads us to happiness—do not forget it. The way of Jesus always leads us to happiness. There will always be a cross, and there will be trials along the way, but it will always lead us to happiness. Jesus does not deceive us. He has promised us happiness and he will give it to us, if we follow his ways."*

Lent marches on and so must we as we continue the solemn fast of forty days toward Easter. We continue to carry the cross of Lent in order to truly enjoy the glory of the resurrection at Easter. Don't forget Fridays are for fish and Stations of the Cross. God Bless.

**Dear Fr. Connors:
What is an indulgence?**

This is great question that many people ask. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* explains: "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints."

The *Catechism* continues: "An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. The faithful can gain indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead."

Grave sins are forgiven in the Sacrament of Penance. Still, even after Confession, the results or effects of sin remain. And while the possibility of eternal punishment is removed when a mortal sin is forgiven in Confession, some punishment for that sin still remains. An indulgence removes or remits that punishment.

Certain practices, such as praying the Stations of the Cross or visiting a church, are indulgenced practices of the Church. Because Christ has given the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven to the Church, She has the power to apply indulgences to pious practices. An indulgence can be applied to oneself or to someone who has died.

In order to acquire a plenary indulgence it is necessary that one perform the indulgenced act, i.e. Stations of the Cross, as well as receive the Sacrament of Penance and the Holy Eucharist and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father. As well it is necessary that the person have no attachment to even venial sin.

The logic of indulgences makes sense when one realizes the gravity of sin. In Confession we are forgiven, but the effects of sin remain. Our sufferings in this life, or in purgatory, remits that punishment for sin. The Church's generosity—through the power of the keys—permits one to receive relief from those punishments through pious actions devotedly practiced.

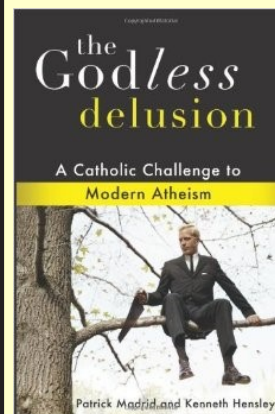

●Chaplaincy volunteers make the first contact with newly admitted patients and then contact parishes/congregations if requested. This is required for HIPPA compliance.

- The Volunteers work one day a week for approximately three to four hours (a.m. or p.m. – Sunday through Saturday).
- Minimal computer skills are required. The volunteers are instructed in the use of a program to locate patients and their room numbers.
- The volunteers interview each new admission and fill out an information card. The volunteers then contact the parish by telephone and prepare a list of patients for the chaplains.
