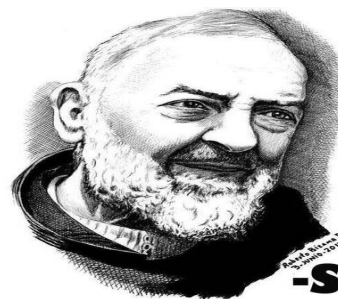

Dear Parishioners:

What a week for our nation and our Church. Pope Francis' Apostolic Visit to the United States dominated the headlines and filled the airwaves. From his arrival at Andrews Air Force Base to his departure from Philadelphia, the Holy Father showed the whole country his humility, his faith and his love.

Millions of people came out to see him and be with him at the large Masses and at his visits to schools, convents, seminaries, prisons, and homeless shelters. His was truly a "Mission of Love" which provided inspiration for many people and much food for thought for all us. His simple message to us was very challenging and provocative.

Of course there are those complainers and cynics, both in and outside the Church, who like to find fault with Pope Francis' style or with his words. Yet Pope Francis simply asked us to answer the call to serve the poor, work for economic opportunity for all people, be good stewards of the earth, protect religious minorities from persecution, promote religious freedom everywhere, defend human life at all stages and welcome the stranger, the immigrant and the refugee.

In Philadelphia, Pope Francis said: "*Most of you know the story of Saint Katharine Drexel, one of the great saints raised up by this local Church. When she spoke to Pope Leo XIII of the needs of the missions, the Pope – he was a very wise Pope! –*

asked her pointedly: 'What about you? What are you going to do?'. Those words changed Katharine's life, because they reminded her that, in the end, every Christian man and woman, by virtue of baptism, has received a mission. Each one of us has to respond, as best we can, to the Lord's call to build up his Body, the Church."

Pope Francis went on to suggest: "*One of the great challenges facing the Church in this generation is to foster in all the faithful a sense of personal responsibility for the Church's mission, and to enable them to fulfill that responsibility as missionary disciples, as a leaven of the Gospel in our world.*" Pope Francis is asking each one of us, priest and laity, old and young, rich and poor, "*what about you?*" What are you going to do to serve the Lord and His Church?

We are offered a great witness of service with the Franciscan Apostolic Sisters who begin their ministry at Our Lady of Mercy Parish this week. Sister Lourdes and Sister Emma moved into their new home this past week and we officially welcome them to OLM at the 10:30AM Mass. The good Sisters are very excited to be living and working at our parish. They hope to help out in our parish school, with our RE Program, visit the sick and homebound, and most importantly pray for our parish and us every day! Welcome to OLM Sr. Emma and Sr. Lourdes!

We install our Religious Education teachers this

weekend. These men and women volunteer much of their free time to ensuring that the children of our parish learn about Jesus and his teachings. We thank all of our RE teachers and aides for their witness to the faith and answer the call to serve the Church.

We thank Mickey St. Jean and Doug Green who direct this important part of the life and ministry of our parish. We give thanks to God for the many families who faithfully participate in our program, the teachers and aides who volunteer so willingly to serve it, and the children who are so open to learning more about their Catholic Faith.

Fr. Connors is in Rome where he attended the ordination of Seminarian Nathan Ricci. Nathan is from Warwick, a graduate of Bishop Hendricken High School and also Providence College. He and fifty of his classmates were ordained Transitional Deacons by Cardinal Dolan at St. Peter's Basilica. In June 2016 Nathan is to be ordained a priest for service in the Diocese of Providence. Prayerful congratulations to Nathan and his classmates!

I offer my sincere thanks and deep gratitude to the many parishioners who have thus far generously donated to the Annual Collection. It is a good start to this critical collection and I am always so grateful for your support and generosity toward the parish. Be well. Do Good. Go Pats. God Bless.

Dear Fr. Connors: What is the difference between a nun and a sister?

In ordinary parlance the terms “sister” and “nun” are used interchangeably to describe women in religious life. Both nuns and sisters are called “religious” or “member of the consecrated life.”

Strictly speaking, however, a nun refers to a member of a contemplative or cloistered religious community. They take perpetual solemn vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. The Carmelites in Barrington, RI or the Trappistines in Wrentham, MA or the Dominicans Nuns in North Guilford, CT would all fall in this category.

Religious sisters are members of active or apostolic religious communities. They ordinarily take perpetual simple vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. The Religious Sisters of Mercy, the Dominicans Sisters of St. Cecelia from Nashville, TN and the Franciscan Apostolic Sisters who will be coming to Our Lady of Mercy all fall in this category of religious life.

While we often refer to all religious sisters as nuns, strictly speaking that term is reserved for those in cloistered or semi-cloistered contemplative religious life. The title “Sister” is used to address both nuns and sisters.

Pope Francis has called this year to be one where the Church reflects on the gift of the religious or consecrated life. All religious—whether religious priests, nuns, monks, sisters or brothers—all belong to this group of Catholic faithful who seek by their way of life to be signs of Heaven in our midst. Through their lives of consecration to the Lord they profess to live evangelical poverty, perfect chastity and obedience to a lawful superior in imitation of Jesus who lived poverty, chastity and obedience.

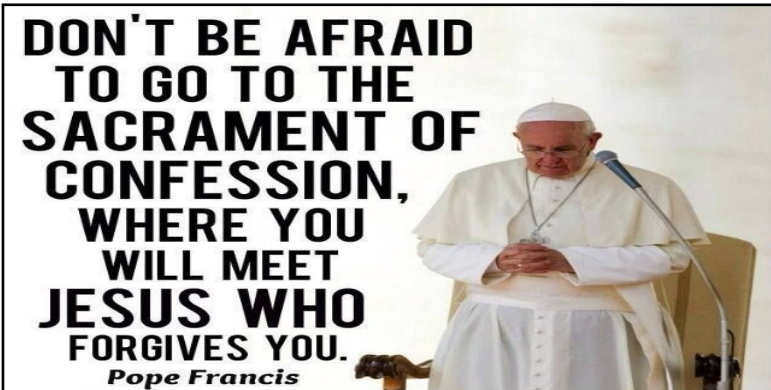



Welcome Franciscan Apostolic Sisters

In 1953, Father Gerardo Z. Filippeto, OFM, a missionary in the Northeastern region of the Philippines, was inspired by the Lord to found an institute of women as auxiliary to his work of evangelization and preservation of the Faith in a vast area deprived of priests. The members are to live the spirit of St. Francis of Assisi and follow the examples of the Blessed Virgin Mary in her service to Jesus and the Apostles. For this reason, it is right that the religious family be called the Franciscan Apostolic Sisters (FAS). It was founded in the spirit of the Third Order Regular of Saint Francis, dedicated to a life of prayer, penance, and apostolate. On December 8, 1964, Bishop Teodulfo D.D., of the Diocese of Tuguegarao granted its Diocesan Approval. On May 18, 1996, Archbishop Diosdado A. Talamayan, after having received a favorable consent and approval from the Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life, issued the Final Decree of its Canonical Erection as a Religious Institute of Diocesan Right. On October 4, 2015, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the Franciscan Apostolic Sisters begin their apostolic work at Our Lady of Mercy Church and School.
