Dear Parishioners:

Last Sunday, I read the New York Times weekly column by Tish Harrison Warren, a priest in the Anglican Church in North America, entitled "*Why We Shouldn't Lose Faith in Organized Religion.*" In it, she interviewed Eboo Patel, an American Muslim and founder and president of Interfaith America, which promotes cooperation across religious differences. I found the column and his comments very uplifting and interesting. He said:

"Particularly in the areas of America where people have higher levels of education...It is considered sophisticated and educated to know only the bad stuff about religion. Of course, that's ironic because to only know the bad stuff is to not actually be educated. So that is discouraging.

I'll tell you what I find encouraging. Catholic sisters just keep on doing what Catholic sisters do, which is taking care of poor people. Our society relies on religious communities to take care of people, to do addiction counseling, to do job training, to do hunger and homelessness work, to do refugee resettlement. We just don't often tell the story of them doing that work. And I think that that's a big problem."

Here's some good news to report at OLM. This weekend we welcome the Superior of the Franciscan Apostolic Sisters, Mother Aida, who is visiting from the Philippines. While she is here she will make visitations at the Franciscan Convent at OLM and the FAS Convent at St. Philip Church in Greenville. Mother Aida is also meeting

with Bishop Henning this week. Please pray for her.

On Wednesday, Mother and the FAS Sisters from Rhode Island depart for Peoria, Illinois, for their Annual Retreat. Please pray for their safe travel as they will be driving to Peoria. And pray their time of retreat is fruitful.

Sister Lourdes and Sister Emma return to OLM during the first week of August. However, they are not returning alone. Mother Aida informed me that Sr. Jane Molitas, FAS, has been assigned to serve at OLM.

Sister Jane comes to us from Nebraska, where she has served at the Seminary of St. Gregory the Great over the last few years. Some of you may remember her from her time at the old Scalabrini Villa Nursing Home several years ago. She joins Sister Lourdes and Sister Emma, living at the Franciscan Convent here at OLM, and working with them at OLM Church and School.

We are very grateful to Mother Aida for this good news and her generosity in assigning Sister Jane to OLM. Sister Jane just celebrated her 25th Anniversary of Religious Profession in June. She is a humble, joyful and holy sister. Welcome to OLM, Sister Jane! Please pray for more vocations to the consecrated life.

In the name of the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary, thank you for your warm welcome to Sister Barbara and Sister Veronica last weekend. Their witness to the work of the FMM Missions serving the poor and needy across the globe is good news. I also thank you for your generous financial support

of the Missions. It, too, is good news!

July 25 – Feast of St. James

The Camino de Santiago, known in English as “The Way of St. James,” is a series of pilgrimage routes through western Europe, with the main one beginning in France, that make the Way to the cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in northwest Spain, where tradition holds that the body of St. James the Greater is buried. For over 1300 years, European pilgrims have walked the Way to their final destination at this renowned cathedral on the Iberian coast. As pilgrims made the Way to the nearby ocean to cool off after the hundreds of miles they had traveled, they began to collect scallop shells as a symbol of the completion of their pilgrim way. This tradition led to the scallop shell becoming a symbol of pilgrimage and of St. James himself. Along the many routes of the “Camino,” as it is more popularly known, the scallop shell was placed on posts to mark the path of the lengthy journey. The French word for a scallop is “coquille,” the most popular preparation is the classic “Coquille St. Jacques,” or scallops of St. James, named for the pilgrim’s shell. This delicious first course or appetizer is used to celebrate the Feast of St. James the Greater on July 25.

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 3/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 1/2 pounds sea scallops
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 2/3 cup dry white wine
- 2 tablespoons Cognac
- 3 tablespoons breadcrumbs
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1/2 cup finely grated Gruyère cheese
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice

Instructions

Dry scallops with a paper towel, then in a large bowl, mix flour, salt, and cayenne pepper. Add scallops to bowl and toss until thoroughly coated in spiced flour mixture. In a large skillet over medium-high heat, melt butter. Add scallops to butter and sauté, turning once, until golden brown on both sides, about 4 minutes. Transfer scallops to a plate and cover to keep warm. Add onions to skillet and sauté, frequently stirring, over medium-high heat for 6 minutes, until they turn light brown. Add white wine to the pan and scrape the bottom of the pan with a spatula to get all the brown bits off the pan and into the sauce. Reduce heat slightly and simmer until sauce has reduced by half. Remove pan from heat and stir in Cognac and scallops. Preheat oven broiler. Divide scallop and sauce mixture between six scallop shells or small ovenproof serving dishes. Do not use glass. Mix bread crumbs, melted butter, and Gruyère cheese; divide and spoon mixture evenly over each dish of scallops. Place dishes about 5 to 6 inches from the broiler and cook until the scallop mixture is hot, bubbly, and browned on top. Sprinkle with lemon juice and serve immediately with a glass of fine French or Spanish wine!

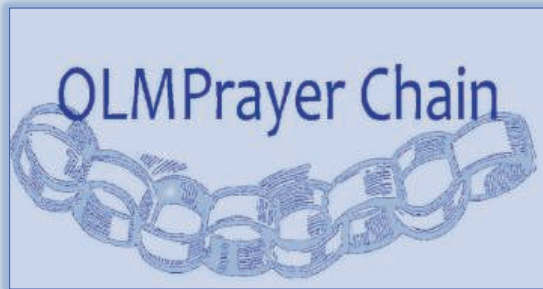


Outreach Update

Flags

MANY CHURCHES display the papal and national flags. This optional custom began fairly recently in Church history.

During periods of national crisis, it became popular to post a country's flag inside churches. The practice showed another layer of unanimity within the assembly of believers, signified the country's prayers for security and peace, and tapped the emotional relationship between national pride and religious belief. When the periods of crisis waned, the flags remained. It probably seemed unpatriotic to remove them.

The papal flag commonly took up a position next to the national flag. It carries the pope's coat of arms, a triple tiara, and crossed keys, symbolizing his ministry as ruler and successor to Peter, the apostle to whom Jesus entrusted the keys to the kingdom of heaven, and who, tradition holds, first served as bishop of the Church at Rome. The tiara and keys are depicted in the noble colors of silver and gold.

The two flags often adorned a church's sanctuary. However, since the Second Vatican Council's appeal for simplicity in the liturgy, the sanctuary has become more reserved for those features necessary for the celebration of Mass. The removal of flags from the sanctuary does not promote disloyalty to church or state, but may assist the prayer of those gathered for the Eucharist by keeping their attention fixed on its central symbols: the altar, ambo, and chair, as well as the bread and wine.

At funerals, a national flag may be placed on a coffin before it arrives at the church and after it leaves (*Order of Christian Funerals*, 132). During the funeral, a coffin is covered with a white pall, symbolizing the Baptismal garment.
